In 2015 Paul agreed to become District Commissioner placing high values to Top Awards ensuring that there is a twice yearly celebration event. Paul has also introduced a District Dinner as well as other social activities in the District calendar to ensure good morale within the area. A project Paul masterminded is a Climbing Wall, volunteers were upskilled to run a climbing wall which visits a number of high volume tourist events in North Norfolk (Cromer Carnival, Worstead Festival etc) this generates names for potential volunteers and young people not just from his



District, but across the country. Since Paul's leadership the young people numbers in the District have grown by 5%

Lee has overseen the creation of a brand new Scout Group in Shipdham.



Queen's Scout Award

Those young adults who become Queen's Scouts have demonstrated their commitment, knowledge and skills as a positive member of their local, national and international communities by completing:

- Eighteen nights away
- 6 activities from the Queen's Scout International, Community and Values list.
- Hold the Duke of Edinburgh's Gold Award or complete
- Skill: Take up a skill and show progress and lasting interest.
- Physical Activity: Take up a physical activity part and achieve set objectives.
- **Service**: Provide service to an individual or the community for twelve months.
- Expedition: Train for and undertake a practice and final expedition over a minimum of 3 days and 2 nights in wild country.
- Residential: Undertake a 5 day and 4 night residential project.
