TASK 1 : Make African Tribal masks using salt dough

EQUIPMENT:

- Makes 1 ball Prep 10 minutes
- Cook 3 hours
- 1 cupful of plain flour (about 250g)
- half a cupful of table salt (about 125g)
- half a cupful of water (about 125ml)

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Preheat the oven to its lowest setting and line a baking sheet with baking parchment.
2. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. Add the water and stir until it comes together into a ball.
3. Transfer the dough to a floured work surface and shape into your chosen mask. You can roll it out and then cut out pieces to decorate the mask, .
4. Put your finished items on the lined baking sheet and bake for 3 hrs or until solid.
5. Leave to cool and then paint.

TASK 2: Create your own African Drumming

EQUIPMENT:

Empty tins or similar

Balloons

Tape or elastic bands

Paper/card/glue for decoration

INSTRUCTIONS:

- **Empty the tin (make sure the top where the lid has come off has been made safe)**
- **Cut the neck of a balloon and stretch the big part over the tin**
- **Secure with tape or an elastic band**
- **Decorate the drum in African colours**

Care to ensure the tin is made safe before attaching the balloon

INSTRUCTIONS

Cut holes in the paper plate for eyes and a mouth

Make small holes at either side to tie string through
