This tribute to Her Majesty will be offered at the Norfolk Showground as the centrepiece of the 2022 Royal Norfolk Show by members of Norfolk's performing arts community under the coordinating leadership of Norfolk's Vice Lord-Lieutenant Peter Wilson, ex-Chief Executive of Norwich's Theatre Royal.

To note Queen Elizabeth's international reputation for dignity and steadfastness there will be music from the world; to commemorate her unwavering support for the Commonwealth there will be dancing and music from Africa; and to celebrate her lifetime of service to the country the entire Showground audience will be invited to sing the National Anthem together with over 1,000 children and adults from across Norfolk and accompanied by a 60-piece orchestra.

So how can Norfolk Scouts be involved?

Schools are being invited to nominate themselves to take part and a number will be chosen – but Norfolk Scouts have also been offered a guaranteed place - and so we are looking for up to 50 young people to take part

To be able to take part they young people must be :

- A member of Cubs, Scouts or Explorers/Young Leaders
- Willing to learn the songs and movement (its wanting to take part not if you can sing or dance!)
- Be prepared to take part in some online sessions and face to face sessions to rehearse (likely to be one each month of April, May and June (face to face will be central to where the participants are from on Sunday afternoons)
- Be free on Sunday 26th June – all day to attend the Norfolk Showground
- Be able to get to the Norfolk Showground on both Wednesday 29th June and Thursday 30th June for 3.30pm (letters will be provided for schools)

What will they need:

- Uniform for the section they are in
- Uniform or black/navy trousers
- Dark shoes/trainers

All young people that take part will also get a special Platinum Jubilee Necker and Woggle to wear for the event
